General Information

Equimillion is an equestrian event with a minimum **\$1 million in prizemoney** exclusively for retired Thoroughbred racehorses across disciplines of Eventing, Jumping, Dressage and Show horse.

Equimillion will showcase the versatility and suitability of Thoroughbreds for careers outside of racing, with the inaugural event to be held on the October long weekend in 2024 at the Sydney International Equestrian Centre, Saxony Road, Horsley Park NSW.

Friday 4th October – Dressage

Saturday 5th October – Show Thoroughbred & Eventing Dressage

Sunday 6th October – Eventing Jumping & Cross-Country

Monday 7th October – Jumping

Conditions of Entry

This Racing NSW event is governed by the Equestrian Australia (EA) General Regulations, applicable to EA Sport Rules and all relevant EA Codes, policies, bylaws, rules, and regulations. The EA Sports rules (i.e., the National Rules for each EA Sport or discipline) and regulations may be accessed on the EA and ENSW websites.

This event will be run under the EA Rules and Regulations, (as defined therein) including the following:

- **Equestrian Australia (EA) Policies and Procedures including:**
- **EA Code of Conduct**
- **Helmet Standards**

All Event competitors will be deemed to have read and accepted the Conditions of Entry and the rules and regulations attached ('the Rules and Regulations')

The Organising Committee (OC) reserves the right to amend the program, these Conditions of Entry and the Rules and Regulations, or any aspect of the Event at its discretion at any time.

The OC reserves the right to accept or refuse any entry.

Each Discipline has rules and regulations specific to that Discipline, available on the EA website.

Breaches of the Rules, Child Safe Standards, and Member Protection Policy may result in disqualification from the Event and depending on the severity of the offence, the athlete and/or their associates may face disciplinary action.

The OC, Technical Delegate/s, Ground Jury and Officials are responsible for ensuring Horse Welfare guidelines and EA Codes of Conduct are observed.

At the time of entry, you will be required to confirm you have read and agree to the Codes of Conduct.

Disclaimer: These rule references are correct at the time of entry. If they change before the competition, the new rules will be applied

Rider Information

EA Membership

All entrants must have current financial Competitor or Participant membership of Equestrian Australia at the date and time of entry. Entries cannot be accepted without your current membership number.

Entries not complying with membership and registration criteria will be declined.

EA Horse Registration

All horses must have Full or Base EA horse registration.

Qualifications

It is encouraged that all combinations are 6 months in training together before entering the competition.

Incomplete or incorrect qualifications may mean an entry is not accepted.

Eventing: MER's are required for CCN1* and CCN2* and one MER at Eva95.

Discipline selections

All competitors are required to ensure they are entering classes that are suitable for the horse to compete in. While Equimillion can be an opportunity for the rider to experiment in a new discipline it is required to appropriately prepare their horse for that discipline. The competition format in each discipline is not designed for first timer participation, and entering horses in a new discipline without adequate preparation and training is discouraged.

Competition Divisions at Equimillion

Junior – Competitors attending Equimillion need to have turned 13 by the start of competition. Show Horse, Jumping and Dressage as per the EA Rules. From 13 until the end of the calendar year, in which they reach the age of 18

Junior Eventing – Refer to Eventing rules. Competitors attending Equimillion need to have turned 13 by the start of the competition. An Athlete is considered a Senior from the beginning of the calendar year in which the Athlete reaches the age of 18.

Amateur – The member is the main rider of the horse on which they are entering, or it is the only horse they ride.

Where classes offer all categories the Junior or Amateur competitor will stay in the same category when entering two disciplines or multiple horses. If the only category for the class is **open** the rider can appear in two categories as long as the rider is a true Junior or Amateur and the open category is the only option.

Example: Kim normally jumps 110cm. The class on offer at Equimillion is the Open 110cm. Kim is also entering the Preliminary Dressage and as she is only a casual rider with no income from riding or training, she can enter the Amateur Preliminary Dressage.

Open Professional – This division is intended for riders who receive part or all of their income (monetary or in-kind) through their activities riding, coaching or training horses. This includes sponsored riders.

The exception to the above description: A rider who receives sponsorship to attend Equimillion in the form of an entry fee.

*** A true Open Professional competitor must stay in the same category over the 4 days of competition.

The OC reserves the right to Transfer competitors between divisions of a class.

If the OC receives evidence that a rider is in breach of these rules then this rider will forfeit any awards and prizes.

Rider Numbers

All horses will be allocated a Bridle Number for the event. The number must be worn on the left (near) side of the bridle or saddle cloth when out of the stable. If you are competing in Dressage bridle numbers must be worn on both sides of the bridle or saddle cloth. When the horse is not competing the bridle numbers must be attached to the halter.

Competitors must provide their own number holders displaying their allocated number.

Competitors in Eventing will be emailed back numbers to be printed for the Cross Country phase.

Bio Security

Entrants, owners or persons in charge of the horse(s) at the Event acknowledge and agree:

- No horses with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs will be available at the event. Equipment, including food and water containers is not to be shared between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitise hands between contacting different horses.

Horse Information

Horse Eligibility

To be eligible to submit a nomination for Equimillion, the horse must meet the following criteria:

- Horse must have been registered with Racing Australia with a microchip and been bred with the intent to race (evidence of race records, trials and/or barrier education and jump outs).
- Brands present on the horse for visual identification and linked with microchip.
- Horse must have officially retired from racing.

All named horses bred in NSW are eligible to compete.

Horses that were not bred in NSW, but meet any of the below criteria will also be eligible to compete:

Horses bred interstate:

- Horse must have been trained, trialled, or raced in NSW. **Horses bred internationally:**
- Horse must have been trained, trialled, or raced in NSW. **Unnamed Horses:**
- Bred in NSW with the intent to race in NSW.

Entering the Event

Nomination and Competition Fee Structure

Entries will open Monday the 19th of August 2024 at 1 pm on Nominate and will close at Midnight 12th of September 2024.

Late Entries will be accepted with a \$100.00 late fee until 10 am the 16th of September 2024.

Nomination Fee - \$600.00 + GST

Nomination fee is non-refundable for horses that meet the eligibility criteria.

If horses do not meet eligibility criteria, the nomination fee will be refunded to the payment method.

- Successful nominations will receive an acceptance email with their Nomination ID Number.

Competition Entry Fee - \$400.00 + GST

The Equimillion Competition event entry fee will be due upon class entries. Competitors entering the Equimillion Competition can enter up to two disciplines across the 4-day competition for the single-entry fee.

Nomination Fee + Competition Entry Fee = 1 Horse Entry in two classes across the disciplines

Venue Facilities and Rules

Competitors/Horse arrivals will be from noon on Thursday 3rd October 2024 and will need to vacate the premises by 10 am Tuesday 8th October 2024.

Stabling

Stable can be booked via nominate when entering.

- Stables - \$45.00 per stable per horse per night
- Compulsory shavings will be added to your first night at \$72.00 (4 x shavings)
- Additional shavings can be purchased with your entry \$18.00ea or at the venue \$20.00ea.
- A Stable bond of \$100 will be charged and refunded if the stable is left clean and swept out at the end of your stay. (Processing of Stable bond will be in the weeks after the event has finished)
- All Stallions must be stabled
- Each Competitor is responsible for the safety of their own tack and personal items.

Camping

Camping Sites all have power and water. Each site has one power plug-in only.

- South Truck Park (35 sites) \$45.00 per site per night
- North Truck Park (60 sites) \$35.00 per site per night

Cabins

Cabins contain two single beds and a heater. No linen is supplied. You will need to bring your pillows, sleeping bags, and blankets.

- Cabin \$60.00 - per night and needs to be vacated by 10 am on your final day.

Day Stay

Day Stay Fee: \$20.00 per day per horse will be charged for any horse that is attending the event and has not selected a stable.

Dogs

No Dogs are allowed in the stables, warm-up arenas or competition areas. We would appreciate all competitors leaving their dogs at home. If you must bring your dog, please keep it in a secure area within the camping grounds.

Vehicles and Road Safety

The grounds at SIEC are public roads and all road rules apply.

- Bicycles must not be ridden during competition hours and when ridden the rider must wear a helmet.
- Two-wheel electric scooters are not permitted at SIEC under any circumstance.
- Golf Buggies will only be used by the OC.

Competitors Parking of all vehicles and trailers is to be in the designated areas only. Vehicles not used for camping will need to be parked in the designated car parks.

Visitors and Guests will need to park in the Event car parks.

Racing NSW Equine Welfare

Racing NSW [Minimum Standards and Guidelines of Equine Welfare](#), which contains compulsory Minimum Standards and also 'best practice' Guidelines for the NSW Thoroughbred Racing Industry. Racing NSW Equine Welfare Program ensures that thoroughbreds that have been domiciled in NSW for the majority of their lives are cared for having regard to appropriate horse welfare standards.

Microchipping

A retired Thoroughbred racehorse entering the competition will have a microchip registered to Racing Australia. The register microchip number is required upon submitting your horse for Nomination, as part of your EA Membership requirements, used to enter classes across the Equimillion Competition, and for Identification purposes on arrival and during the event.

Soundness

All horses competing at Equimillion are required to pass an Arrival Assessment which includes a baseline soundness assessment at the walk. Judges and Officials in all the Equimillion disciplines are authorized to eliminate horses should they feel that they are not appropriately sound for the discipline they are competing in. Lameness may not compete and can be referred to the Event vet.

Medication Control

Medication Control (Swabbing) of horses will be conducted as per EA Medication Control Policy guidelines at this event to protect the welfare of the horses and to ensure a level playing field for all competitors. All winners across the disciplines will be tested, random testing will be conducted on all horses. All positive results are an automatic disqualification from the Event and Sanctions from EA.

In the case of samples that are tested not to be free of prohibited substances ie a positive test, then the person responsible will be advised and dealt with in a manner that is determined by Equestrian Australia / FEI medication control rules and procedures guidelines. <https://www.equestrian.org.au/medication-control>

Body Condition

Any horse that arrives at Equimillion with a below 2 body score of 5 will consult with a vet on arrival and may not be allowed to compete. Competitors could find it useful to have their vet assess their horses body score prior to Nominating the horse for the competition – [link here](#). Officials in all the Equimillion disciplines are authorized to eliminate horses should they feel that they are not appropriately conditioned for the competition.

Veterinarians

Will be in attendance during the competition. Please contact Randwick Equine Centre on 9399 7722 if you require a vet outside of competition hours. Randwick Equine Centre are located across the road from SIEC.

Welfare Concerns

Those who are on the Racing NSW Excluded list can't compete. Any reports prior, during and or after the Equimillion competition will be investigated. Practices considered to be a welfare concern include but not limited to; inflicting harm, overworking, misuse of training equipment, or malnourished. During competition, officials have the right to order veterinary evaluations of any horse who appears to be unsound or in physical discomfort or distress.

Horse Health Certificates & Vaccination Records

Random horse identification checks will take place over the course of the Event. Our Event team (Stable Manager, Steward, and Equimillion Official) can request to scan your horse's microchip at any time. Please make sure you have your EA Horse Registration Document on hand.

Scratching and Refunds

Nomination fees of \$600.00 is **non-refundable**, for any horse that has been scratched or withdrawn from the Competition. The nomination fee is separate from entering the event.

Competition Entry Fee:

Any withdrawal/scratching of a horse/rider after Monday 16th September (Close of Entries) up until 10am Thursday 3rd October 2024 for the following reason/medical/veterinary grounds or are classed as being unfit to compete, shall be refunded 50% of the Competition Entry fee, 100% of camping, stables and shavings fees less a \$100.00 administration fee. This will be refunded only if a medical/veterinary certificate is received within **48 hours** of the notification. **Late Certificates will not be accepted.**

From 10 am Thursday 3rd October 2024 no refunds will be issued.

To scratch or withdraw a horse from the competition or apply for a refund the competitor or owner must complete the Event form.

Protest and Complaints

The Organising Committee reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide any class
- To transfer competitors between sections of the class
- To alter the advertised times or days
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating a reason
- To make additional statements with regard to rules/ processes based on horse welfare and safety

Protest and Complaints

No competitor is to directly approach any judge, steward, course builder or any other official before, during or after the competition with disputes or complaints.

All queries must be made in writing to the organising committee located in Event Square within 30 minutes of the results being posted publicly. A Query/Protest form is available at the office.

All protests must be made in writing at the Event office to be considered by the Ground Jury and must be accompanied by \$1000 which will be returned to the competitor if their protest is upheld. The decision of the Ground Jury will be final.

Competition Information and Key Dates

Entries will close on the 12th of September 2024 with a late fee up until 10 am on the 16th of September 2024.

A class list will be sent to all competitors at 4 pm on the 16th of September 2024 to check you have entered the correct class and category.

Rider's Notes, Stable, Camping and Cabin allocations will be published 24th September 2024.

Final Draws will be published at 2 pm on the 26th of September 2024.



Number Of Disciplines

Entry into the Equimillion competition allows the combination to enter **two classes across the disciplines** over the 4-day competition in line with EA National Rule:

1st Selection – 1 class only exception is Led	Optional second Discipline – 1 class only
Dressage (Friday)	Show Horse, Eventing, or Jumping
Show Horse (Saturday)	Dressage or Showjumping
Eventing (Saturday & Sunday)	Dressage or Showjumping
Jumping (Monday)	Dressage, Show Horse, or Eventing

Combinations entering Eventing as the primary discipline and Jumping as the secondary discipline need to stay within 10cm of each class height.

Combinations entering Jumping as the primary discipline and Eventing as the secondary discipline will need MERs to enter as per the Eventing EA and Event rules.

Riders may ride more than one horse at the event, however, there must be only one rider per horse.

Prizemoney & Classes

Total prizemoney of \$30,000 per Championship class - prizemoney paid down to 5th place.

If a class has fewer than 7 competitors, the OC reserves the right to cancel the class and/or allow the competitors to change class.

All Championship class winners will be swabbed after the presentation. It is the responsibility of the rider to have the horse at presentation ready.

- On completion of presentation, a Medication Control Steward will accompany the horse to the Swabbing Box. The horse will need to have a responsible person for the horse – Rider/Owner/Carer. (The responsible person needs to be over 18 Years of age) This person is responsible for staying with the horse and signing all documents regarding the swab.
- Once in the swab box the veterinarian will collect a blood sample from the horse and a urine sample will also be attempted by the Medication Control Office.
- The Medication Control Office will explain the entire process to the responsible person of the horse.

Please Note: Payments can take several weeks & will only be paid once lab results are received.

Individual Champions Points

Horse and Rider combinations in the Dressage, Jumping and Show Horse classes will receive points for each phase to calculate the Championship placings.

Points will be allocated from 35 points for 1st place to 1 point for 35th place. Points are awarded only where the combination has completed all divisions/phases of a class without elimination or disqualification.

The points received in each phase are totalled to decide the Class Championship placings.

Eventing Scoring – As per EA National Eventing Rules.

If a horse is eliminated, retired, does not finish, or withdraws from any phase they can not be placed.

Equality In Classes

Jumping and Dressage - Refer to EA Rules.

Show Horse – A preferential judge to be allocated in each class in the event of a tied final score.

Eventing – In the event of equality between two or more combinations, the Champion is decided by:

- a) The best cross-country score including penalties for faults at obstacles, time penalties, and any other penalty that the Athlete may have incurred on the cross-country test.
- b) If these are still equality, the champion is decided in favour of the Athlete with the highest positive dressage points.

If there is still equality, please refer to EA Eventing rules 528.1.6 Final Classification Tie (Individual)

Equality in the Championships' will be resolved for places 1st to 5th. If equality cannot be resolved, riders will be awarded equal placing and share points. For example, one combination may be awarded 6th place and receive 30 points, two riders may be awarded 7th place so each will be awarded 28.5 points, then the next placed rider would be awarded 9th and 27 points.

Presentations

Championship presentations for Show Horse will take place after the Championship class.

For Eventing, Dressage, and Jumping an announcement will be made when the final results are posted online, and the presentation will take place approximately 30 minutes after the announcement. In the event of a protest or inquiry regarding the results, the presentation will be delayed until 30 minutes have passed with no changes.

Injury and Liabilities

- Any competitor who falls from their horse MUST be cleared by the Medical Services Provider at the event before they are eligible to ride again.
- As a condition of entry, riders, their connections, and spectators will indemnify Racing NSW and Equestrian Australia, Equestrian NSW and The Sydney International Equestrian Centre against all claims, losses, damages, and legal action howsoever occurring.
- All horse owners and Event competitors will be personally responsible for the damages to any third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their animals.

Gear Check

Discipline Rules relating to gear checks must be adhered to as per the discipline rules (links above). EA Stewards will complete the checks either prior to entering the warm-up or at the completion of the test and/or phase.

Dress and Saddlery

- Riders must compete in attire required under EA Rules.
- In the event of hot weather, the OC may permit riders to compete without riding coats.
- A designated EA tagging official will be on site, to apply approved helmet tags in conformance with Rule 538.3.1, which comes into effect from 1 January 2020. All helmets must be tagged in accordance with the EA Helmet tagging policy.
- The EA tag does not verify that the helmet is safe or in working order. It only verifies that the helmet complies with the specific standards as mandated by the EA Eventing Rules.
- Body Protectors are compulsory under EA Eventing Rules and must comply with rule 538.3.1. From 1 January 2020, body protectors will need to be manufactured after 2009 and comply with:
 - EN13158:2009 level 3 • BETA 2009 Level 3
 - EN13158:2018 level 3
 - BETA 2018 Level 3

Equimillion New Star Thoroughbred Class



The aim of the **Equimillion New Star Thoroughbred Classes (ENST)** is to showcase the versatility and trainability of the Thoroughbred.

The nomination and entry fee for the Equimillion New Star Thoroughbred Class at Equimillion 2024 Event is free for all Equimillion eligible horses recently retired from racing.

To be eligible to nominate for the ENST the retired Thoroughbred racehorse must be recently retired from racing within the year of the Equimillion annual competition, after 1st October 2023.

All horses must meet the [Equimillion NSW eligibility](#).

Jumping and Eventing horses must be 4 years of age or older as per the EA discipline rules to compete.

Show Horse is 3 years of age or older on 1 August in the year of the relevant event or competition for both Led and Ridden class.

Dressage - All horses must be 3 years of age - determined by natural birthday, or older.

Horses can only enter **one ENST class** at Equimillion.

Competitors entering a second discipline in addition to the ENST class will need to enter and pay the entry fee as per the Event schedule.

Please note: Combinations cannot enter the same discipline as per the EA rules referring to the number of tests or rounds per day. The only exception to the rule is Show Horse. Horses can enter an ENST Led or Ridden class and pay an entry fee for a Show Horse led or Ridden class. (The horse can do Show horse Led and Show Horse ridden – 1 entry in each class)

Please Note ** EvA 65 is only for Juniors and Amateur Competitors, CCN1*-S and CCN2*-S will be an open class only.

Eventing will run under the EA Eventing Rules -

- All horses must be 4 years of age or older.
- Horses and riders must be qualified to compete at the relevant level as per EA Eventing Rules. Dressage
- Dressage test to be ridden from memory. No Callers allowed.
- Dress and Saddlery: According to EA National Eventing Rules.
- Starting order: By draw as per EA Eventing Rule 533.2 for dressage and cross-country.
- Course specifications as per EA National Eventing Rules.
- Bridle or saddle blanket number compulsory for dressage, jumping, and cross-country and back number for Cross Country.
- Riding Down is the act of competing at a lower level than that for which a horse and rider as a combination has achieved a MER.
- Riding Down one level from a higher level for which the combination has achieved a MER carries no penalty. Riding Down two or more levels will incur 7.5 penalties, to be added to

the total of faults for the three phases, applicable for all levels at Equimillion Eventing Competition. Horses being ridden down two grades are ineligible for any leaderboard points.

- It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the Organising Committee at the time of entry that he is riding down two or more levels.

Scoring – As per EA National Eventing Rules. If a horse is eliminated, retired, does not finish, or withdraws from any phase they cannot be placed.

Combinations entering Eventing as the primary discipline and Jumping as the secondary discipline need to stay within 10cm of each class height.

Example: Combination entered EVA 95, The Combination can only enter in the 90cm or 100cm jumping.

** Equimillion New Star Eventing horses cannot enter another Eventing class as per EA rules and regulations. Combinations can enter and pay the entry fee for another discipline over the 4 days of competition as per the Event schedule.

Dressage will be run under the EA Dressage rules.

- All horses must be 3 years of age - determined by natural birthday, or older.
- Gloves are compulsory, white or off white preferred may be same colour as coat
- Test to be ridden from memory. No callers allowed.
- Starting order will be according to a random draw.
- All Dressage tests will be run in accordance with Current EA Rules in the EA Dressage Competition Rules, which can be obtained from the EA website.
- Whips are permitted (not exceeding 1.2m including tassel for horses and 1.0m for ponies)
- Horses may not compete below their graded level (if an official dressage grading applies).
- Only snaffle bits are allowed.
- Spurs can be used at all levels.
- Bridle numbers must be worn on both sides of the bridle or saddle blanket.
- Bridle numbers will be issued by the Event.
- Scoring - As per EA National Dressage Rules.
- Gear Check – Rule: 4.4
 - A gear check is compulsory for each test.
 - All competitors must present to the Gear Steward after their Test
 - Failure to have a gear check will incur elimination
- If a horse is eliminated, does not finish, or is scratched from a test no points will be awarded.

** Equimillion New Star Dressage horses cannot enter another Dressage class as per EA rules and regulations. Combinations can enter and pay the entry fee for another discipline over the 4 days of competition as per the Event schedule.

Competitors jumping 130cm or over would then only be eligible for the 120cm class.

Please Note ** Jumping 65cm is only for Juniors and Amateur Competitors. Jumping 110cm and 120cm - will be an open class.

- The Jumping competition will be conducted under the EA National Jumping Rules.
- Horses must be 4 years of age or older.
- Saddlery as per EA National Jumping Rules
- Course walks are only permitted during designated times, and competitors need to be in official riding dress.
- Riders must ride in the order of the draw and must not hold up proceedings on the day.
- EA Stewards will complete the Gear checks.
- Combinations entering Jumping and Eventing need to stay within 10cm of each class height.

Combinations entering Jumping as the primary discipline and Eventing as the secondary discipline will need MERs to enter as per the Eventing EA and Event rules.

Scoring - As per EA National Show Jumping Rules.

If a horse is eliminated, does not finish or is scratched from a round, no points will be awarded.

The Organising Committee reserves the right to change a combination class if we find the horse is competing regularly at a higher level. We request Competitors who are currently competing stay at the same heights in the fairness of the sport.

** Equimillion New Star Jumping horses cannot enter another jumping class as per EA rules and regulations. Combinations can enter and pay the entry fee for another discipline over the 4 days of competition as per the Event schedule.

Show Thoroughbred New Star Eligibility – The retired Thoroughbred racehorse must be recently retired from racing within the year of the Equimillion annual competition, after 1st October 2023.

Show Thoroughbred Hunter - A show hunter will ideally have a greater depth of girth, and although not lacking in length of rein or cleanness through the gullet, it will have far greater natural substance of the neck. Generally, the hunter will have shorter cannon bones and overall heavier bone. A show hunter will still move across the ground in a flowing manner. The show hunter should display sufficient substance and bone, as this is the key differential between a hack and a hunter.

Show Thoroughbred combinations can compete in a Led class and Ridden Show Horse or Show Hunter class (Horses must nominate to be either a show horse or show hunter, they cannot be both).

- Riders may ride more than one horse on the day however there must be only one rider per horse.
- Conflicts of Interest MUST be submitted in writing to the Organising Committee 30 minutes prior to the commencement time of the class.
- Workouts will be emailed to competitors following close of nominations.
- Riders must complete the 2 set workouts in the nominated ridden class on the same horse.
- Rider and horse combinations may compete in one class section only, and must choose between Show Horse or Show Hunter.
- Competitors must be in the marshalling area at the allocated class time. Classes will not be delayed for any competitor who is not present at the commencement time of the class.

- Where entry numbers permit, classes may be split into heats.
- Competitors will complete 2 different workouts, the first workout in Ring 1 and then immediately proceed to Ring 2 and complete the 2nd workout.
- The horses will then enter Ring 2 at the completion of the last horse to work and will walk, trot, and canter as a collective group around the ring for the judges.
- Following completion of the horses working as a collective group in Ring 2, all horses will line up while they await the results of the placings.
- The Ring 1 and Ring 2 judge scores will be totalled by the official scorer to decide the Class Championship placings and applicable prizemoney.
- Ribbons will be awarded to those horses placing 1st-5th.
- Drug testing of horses (swabbing) will occur in accordance with the EA National Medical Control Policy and the Equine Anti-Doping and Medical Control rules. Full rule details are available at www.equestrian.org.au
- Breastplates can be worn.
- Riding Attire- Blue, Black, Brown, Tweed coloured Riding jacket.
- Hats & Helmets - EA Approved safety helmets MUST be worn by any person when mounted.
- Led Classes - Handler Attire- Women to wear a dress or skirt (preferably knee length or below knee, shoulders to be covered) or trousers and jacket or tailored suit, closed in shoes suitable for the arena surface, sensible hat. Minimal jewellery may be worn.
- Men to wear smart dress pants, tie and jacket or tailored suit with hat, shoes to suit for the arena surface. Riding attire is acceptable in led classes.

** Equimillion New Star Led horses can enter the Show Horse Ridden class. The Combination can enter and pay the entry fee for the additional class or another discipline over the 4 days of competition as per the Event schedule.
